VISIT TO BLETCHLEY PARK

Tuesday 12th October, 2021

Bletchley Park is a 19th Century mansion and estate on the edge of Milton Keynes. It was the main centre for Allied code breaking and analysis during the Second World War and the site where the world's first computer, the Colossus, was invented. It is now a vibrant heritage attraction and museum with a working replica of the Colossus computer*. There are catering outlets to suit all tastes.

**The Colossus computer is found in the National Computer Museum, for which there is an extra entrance fee of £5*
